Fee Level: This indicates the level of the fee.

- “F” indicates the fee payable by each full-time student per Fall or Winter Term;
- “P” indicates the fee payable by each part-time student per Fall or Winter Term; and,
- “S” indicates the fee payable by each student per Spring or Summer Term.

Augustana: This indicates whether or not the fees are assessed to students at Augustana Faculty in accordance with Section 5 (3) of the Bylaw Respecting Dedicated Fee Units.

- “Yes” denotes that students at Augustana Faculty are assessed the fee at the same rate as all other undergraduate students.
- “No” denotes that this fee is not assessed to students at Augustana Faculty.

Joint Consent: This identifies the body that must consent to the amendment of the fee, as set out in Section 4 (4) of the Bylaw Respecting Dedicated Fee Units.

Refugee Student Fund	The Student Refugee Fund shall be used for the support of those students selected as participants in the World University Service of Canada Student Refugee Sponsorship Program.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The Refugee Student Fund, administered by the Student Refugee Program Board, shall be used for the support of four undergraduate refugee students at the University of Alberta selected by the World University Service of Canada Refugee Student Sponsorship Committee and consisting of: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. one refugee student in his/her first year of study; b. one refugee student in his/her second year of study; c. one refugee student in his/her third year of study; and d. one refugee student in his/her fourth year of study. 2. The Student Refugee Program Board (SRPB) shall allocate the total annual application cost required by the national WUSC office from the total fee collected. 3. The Student Refugee Program Board (SRPB) shall allocate from the total fee collected an amount equivalent to the current HUB 4-bedroom residence rate, to be distributed to the student in his/her first year of study for the cost of housing for the first 12 months of their stay. 4. The SRPB shall allocate 3% of the remaining amount after the allocation in (3) to be distributed to the WUSC Local Committee for various administrative duties throughout the year, provided that a budget for these activities is forwarded to the SRPB. 5. The SRPB shall allocate 2% of the remaining amount after the allocation in (3) to the WUSC SRP Contingency Fund. 6. During their four year tenure, each SRP student shall receive the total amount that is collected by the dedicated fee unit during their first year of sponsorship, minus the various costs associated with 2, 3, 4 & 5. Specifically, this amount shall be disbursed as follows (rounded to the nearest dollar): <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. In his/her first year: 66% of the remaining amount after the allocation in (3): <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. the student shall receive an amount totalling to 39% of the remaining amount after the allocation in (3) that is dispersed in equal monthly instalments for the first six months; ii. the student shall receive an amount totalling to 27% of the remaining amount after the allocation in (3) that is dispersed in equal monthly instalments for the last six months; b. In his/her second year: 16% of the remaining amount after the allocation in (3); c. In his/her third year: 7% of the remaining amount after the allocation in (3); and d. In his/her fourth year: 6% of the remaining amount after the allocation in (3). 7. Where a SRP student requires more than the amount allotted in (6), or requires a different payment scheme, this shall be decided by two-thirds majority by the SRPB. The SRPB shall submit a report detailing funds dispersed at the next Students' Union Finance Committee meeting immediately following such disbursement of funds.

Alberta Public Interest Research Group Fund	The Alberta Public Interest Research Group Fund shall be used for the support of the Alberta Public Interest Research Group.	The mandate of the Alberta Public Interest Research Group is: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. to allow undergraduate students to work on public policy issues through undergraduate directed research, education, and action initiatives; 2. to develop, advertise, and implement a procedure by which undergraduate students wishing to have their contributions to the Alberta Public Interest Research Group fund refunded to them may do so; and 3. to develop and implement policy on <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. granting funds to undergraduate students to allow them to work on public-policy research, education, and action initiatives; b. an appeals process for undergraduate students pursuant to (a.); c. addressing conflicts-of-interest; d. and ensuring proper expenditure of funds granted.
Gateway Student Journalism Fund	The Gateway Student Journalism Fund shall be used for the support of the Gateway Student Journalism Society.	The mandate of the Gateway Student Journalism Society is: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. to publish at least fifteen issues of the Gateway during each Fall or Winter term; 2. to offer advertising rates discounted by at least ten percent to the Students' Union and registered student groups; 3. to develop, advertise, and implement actions to resolve complaints about the editorial policy of the Gateway and its staff; and 4. to devote a portion of any budget surplus to providing scholarships for undergraduate students.
The Landing Fund	The Landing Fund shall be used for the support of The Landing Society for Gender and Sexual Diversity.	The mandate of The Landing is: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To offer support for gender and sexual diversity at the University of Alberta and related communities; 2. To support LGBTQPIANU+ communities and individuals, as well as their supporters, friends, families, and loved ones; 3. To promote gender equity on a broad scale, and advocate for the safety and acceptance of individuals of all genders and sexualities in campus life; and 4. To offer a safe space to LGBTQPIANU+ individuals, as well as workshops, educational sessions, and outreach activities for all persons.

Mandate: Mandates only apply to Operational Dedicated Fee units, and are the requirements they must fulfill under Bylaw in accordance with Section 5 (4) of a Bylaw Respecting Operational Dedicated Fee Units
