- 5) Two individuals running or holding a position in such a manner will be referred to as a slate for the purpose of these principles, though a different term will be the official term used in bylaw
- 6) Slates will be tested in the coming year for students' council elections (not including executive elections), and may be subject to particular additional rules around elections and campaigning
- 7) The programs that allow their students to run in slates will be chosen based on how accessible being part of students council currently is for the students, and how effective slates would be in making it more accessible

BONDARCHUK MOVES TO, upon recommendation of Bylaw Committee, approve Bill 11: Amendments to (Bylaw 100) Committee Mandates in Students' Union Bylaw in second reading based on the following first principles:

- 1) Dedicated Fee Unit financial reviews and disbursement are approved by Finance Committee on an annual basis.

A Bylaw Respecting Students' Council

1 Definitions

- 1. In this bylaw
 - a. "Councillor" means any member of Students' Council except
 - i. the President of the Students' Union,
 - ii. a Vice President of the Students' Union.
 - iii. the Undergraduate Board of Governors Representative,
 - iv. the Speaker of Students' Council, or
 - v. the General Manager of the Students' Union;
 - b. "faculty" means
 - i. any entity designated by University of Alberta General Faculties Council policy as a faculty, except the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research, the Faculty of Library and Information Studies, and the Faculty of Extension,
 - ii. all undergraduate students registered at the University of Alberta in Open Studies;
 - c. "faculty population" means the average number of undergraduate students enrolled in a given faculty in a Fall term and the Winter term immediately following it;
 - d. "introductory meeting" means the annual meeting of those persons elected to serve on Students' Council for the coming year;
 - e. "legislation" means
 - i. Students' Union bylaws,
 - ii. Students' Union political policies,
 - iii. Students' Council standing orders, and
 - iv. general orders of Students' Council;
 - f. "Speaker" means the Speaker of Students' Council or, in their absence, any individual designated has having the responsibilities of the Speaker of Students' Council;
 - g. "standing committee" means
 - i. the Audit Committee,
 - ii. the Bylaw Committee,
 - iii. the Council Administration Committee,
 - iv. the Finance Committee,
 - v. the Nominating Committee, or

la Faculté Saint-Jean;

- e. shall monitor the Finance Committee's allocation of the Campus Recreation Enhancement Fund, the Golden Bear and Panda Legacy Fund, and the Refugee Student Fund;
- f. shall annually select the Students' Union auditor
- g. shall oversee the Students' Union external audit and include it with the Committee's report on the audit to Council;
- h. shall review the Students' Union's audited financial statements in advance of their presentation to Students' Council:
- i. shall review all alterations made to the Students' Union's budget for the purposes of verifying compliance with Students' Union legislation;
- j. shall review for appropriateness and compliance with the Students' Union's budget the transactions of the Students' Union organizational units;
- k. shall review all expenditures made on Students' Union credit cards;
- I. shall investigate any inappropriate transactions or significant variances against the Students' Union's budget;
- m. has the authority to require to appear before it, in a reasonable period of time, any Students' Union employee and/or member of the Executive;

2. The Bylaw Committee

- a. shall draft bylaws as required by Students' Council;
- b. shall draft referendum and plebiscite questions as required by Students' Council;
- c. shall make recommendations to Students' Council on Students' Union bylaws where such recommendations are not the purview of any other standing committee; and
- d. has the power to make, to Students' Union bylaws, alterations that do not alter the meaning of the bylaws in question.

3. The Council Administration Committee

- a. has authority to amend, adopt, or rescind standing orders of Students' Council after an initial set of standing orders has been adopted by Students' Council;
- b. shall make recommendations to Students' Council on the structure of Students' Council and standing committees;
- c. shall oversee the Speaker and the Chief Returning Officer of the Students' Union;
- d. shall oversee the progress of Students' Council's legislative agenda;
- e. shall review recommendations of the Discipline, Interpretation and Enforcement Board within two meetings of release of the ruling.

4. The Finance Committee

- a. shall recommend budgets to Students' Council as required by Students' Union legislation;
- b. shall make recommendations to Students' Council on alterations to the Students' Union operating budget;
- c. shall make recommendations to Students' Council on expenditures of funds from the Projects Allocation:
- d. shall make recommendations to Students' Council on legislation dealing with Students' Union finances as it considers appropriate or as required by Students' Council;
- e. shall regulate and approve the methods used by the Registrar's Office in disbursement and appeal of the Access Fund;
- f. shall make grants and has the authority to set an implement policy regarding the disbursal of funds from the Campus Recreation Enhancement Fund, the Golden Bear and Panda Legacy Fund, the Refugee Student Fund, and the portion of the Students' Union operating budget designated for grants to Student Groups;
- g. shall oversee, review, and approve as necessary the contracts and agreements between the Students' Union and Dedicated Fee Unit organizations as outlined in the Bylaw 6000 schedule;
- h. shall conduct an annual financial review of each Operational Dedicated Fee Units as outlined in Bylaw 6200;
- i. has authority to grant loans to student groups in amounts not exceeding \$1,500 per student group;
- j. may delegate the granting of funds where the Finance Committee has established standing orders identifying the delegate and comprehensive regulations within which the delegate must exercise its

- discretion when granting;
- k. may establish, amend, eliminate, and bestow awards recognizing student involvement, such awards to be funded by the Student Involvement Endowment Fund and/or external sources, as outlined in Finance Committee Standing Orders;
- I. shall bestow all externally-funded awards delegated to it by the Students' Union Executive Committee; and
- m. may establish, amend, eliminate, and bestow awards recognizing outstanding undergraduate teaching at the University of Alberta.
- n. The Finance Committee may establish such rules and procedures as may be necessary for the fulfillment of its mandate and may delegate this authority as it deems necessary.

5. The Nominating Committee

- a. shall solicit and review applications from Students' Union members for student-at-large representative positions on General Faculties Council and its subcommittees, University advisory committees, University executive hiring committees, and the Senate;
- b. shall recommend to Council the appointment of undergraduate students-at-large to serve on General Faculties Council subcommittees, University advisory committees, University executive hiring committees, and the Senate;
- c. shall recommend to Council the appointment of undergraduate students to serve on General Faculties Council when seats remain vacant after a election;
- d. has authority to determine the criteria and application process for student positions appointed by Students' Council.

6. The Policy Committee

- a. shall make recommendations to Students' Council on Students' Union political policy;
- b. shall make recommendations to Students' Council on Students' Union political policy respecting undergraduate tuition at the University of Alberta;
- c. shall receive reports from the Students' Union Executive Committee on advocacy activities and evaluate their effectiveness; and
- d. can make editorial changes to all political policy.
- 7. Standing committees have the authority to make recommendations to Students' Council on matters related to their mandates but not explicitly set out in this bylaw.
- 8. Students' Council has the authority to require recommendations from standing committees on matters related to their mandates but not explicitly set out in this bylaw.

18 Conflict-of-Interest

- 1. No person shall use a Students' Union position that they hold to further personal business interests.
- 2. No person may hold a Students' Union position who
 - a. is party to any contract or agreement with the Students' Union, excepting contracts or agreements directly relating to that person's employment by the Students' Union; or
 - b. has any interest in a contract or agreement with the Students' Union, excepting contracts or agreements directly relating to that person's employment by the Students' Union.
- 3. Does not apply to any person by reason only
 - a. of the receipt of any properly-approved honorarium, commission, or allowance from the Students' Union;
 - b. of being a non-executive member of any registered student group which has any contract or agreement with the Students' Union; or
 - c. of the sale of goods or services to the Students' Union in the ordinary course of business, at competitive prices, and in accordance with Students' Union procedures.
- 4. No member of Students' Council shall vote on a motion relating to a student group or organization of which they are a member unless that organization is a faculty association.
 - a. Membership in an organization shall be defined as
 - i. regular meeting attendance and voting and/or speaking privileges at meetings; or
 - ii. holding office within that organization
- 5. If a councillor has a conflict of interest and votes on a motion in Students' Council or any one of its standing

- 1.) As the University of Alberta has no English language proficiency requirement for student enrolled at Campus St. Jean, there are some University of Alberta students who have no or very limited English proficiency
- 2.) Student Council's *Campus Saint-Jean Linguistic Accessibility* Policy affirms our commitment to increasing bilingual language accessibility for French speakings students enrolled at Campus Saint-Jean
- 3.) A bylaw shall be created stipulating that all Students Council political policies and bylaws will be translated and made available in French
- 4.) This bylaw shall outline the process and timeline for review and translation of bylaw and political policy
- 5.) Students' Council will write and pass bylaw and political policy in English
- 6.) In all cases the English version of political policy and bylaw will be enforceable.
- 7.) Bylaw and political policy will be periodically reviewed for changes and translated
- 8.) This bylaw will contain a clause delaying the implementation of this bylaw until a sustainable structure for translation can be established"

It appears the Board composition is going to look very different for the new term as several of the terms will be expiring later this year. I thought it was an interesting choice for the NDP government to simply let the terms of the current PC appointees run as opposed to ending the terms early.

Dear Council,

This Council meeting signals the end of January, meaning there's only three months left for our terms this year. If you're still curious about running for an Executive position, my job shadow day will be on February 4^{th} from 9:30 am -4 pm, and there's definitely space for people to tag along.

Here is a report on my duties to date:

1. University Institutional Strategic Plan (ISP)

Currently, the University is synthesizing all 400 (!) pages of feedback it has received so far on the ISP into a rough document for the entire campus community to review. I'm hopeful this will be circulated prior to Reading Week.

At our most recent meeting, we presented our findings on sustainability as well as promoting interdisciplinary work, which our current Faculty Evaluation methods do not foster. We also took a look at where there may be gaps in the plan, alongside potential values or principles for the final document. Lastly, we took at look at a potential structure for the ISP and next steps for February.

2. Quality Instruction, Festival of Teaching, and Teaching Tenure Stream

There's been some big movement on both of these fronts for me: the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry is running their own Festival of Teaching spotlight event in late April after finals to showcase excellent instructors within their Faculty. FGSR will be involved in the event in some capacity. I was hoping to have closer to three or four Faculties running FoT, but this is allowing me to focus my events on running the event well with two Faculties.

On the teaching stream, the Committee on the Learning Environment set investigating a teaching tenure stream as one of the large priorities for the committee to address moving forward, which I am very glad to see (seeing how it took the majority of my year!!!). For roughly the next six – eight months, a subcommittee will examine what impact on the learning environment and on quality instruction a teaching stream has for the U of A, and then likely present it to GFC for consideration when a stream is implemented.

3. University Standing Committees

The Centre for Teaching and Learning Advisory Committee was one standing committee that met over the past two weeks, though it was a very productive meeting. It features all of the Associate Deans (Undergraduate) across campus, and a lot of good feedback around teaching and learning was given. In particular, we discussed universal standards for classrooms (such as Powerpoint projectors or whiteboards), MOOCs, eCampus Alberta as well as eUSRIs.



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In particular, we were looking at how receptive instructors would be to a more standardized administration of eUSRIs to avoid lower student response rates, because both students and instructors benefit from higher response rates and more feedback on instruction.

The Museums Policy Committee also met, and they were listening intently to the ISP planning process. In particular, they believe they have a role to play in responding to the TRC and community engagement. Students' Library Advisory Committee also met, where we discussed the reserve room for borrowing textbooks as well as Open Education Week March $7^{th} - 11^{th}$.

Lastly, the Chancellor Search committee has been active, and is currently receiving applications for a new University Chancellor.

4. General Faculties Council: CLE, ASC, GFC

In addition to a teaching tenure stream, the other two priorities for the Committee on the Learning Environment this year are looking at universal standards for all classrooms and multi-faceted evaluation of instructors, including peer-to-peer evaluations.

The Academic Standards Committee approved a new program for in ALES and Business, revised American High School entrance requirements, and received the annual report on enrolment from the Registrar's Office.

General Faculties Council primarily had a discussion around academic governance at the U of A, which was a very lively discussion. The conversation started with GFC not being particularly mandatory or relevant for members, as reflected in 71 of 158 members of GFC actually being present at the meeting. The meeting time of GFC was also brought up and not dismissed this time, which makes me hopeful they will consider a change. Councilor Christensen had a great idea in only changing one meeting time as a trial to see if it would be more effective.

The 2013 Report on Academic Governance at the U of A by the SU was looked at more favorably than the one the previous U of A President put forward, as the SU report got at the tensions behind achieving engaging and meaningful conversations back into governance. I believe that GFC Executive will find a way to review all the work that's been done and then propose a rough plan to GFC on moving forward.

5. COFA: LSA, PERCS, Bylaw 8100 Change

I met with the Law Students' Association President, and things seem to be going well in their Faculty. I'm also impressed with how they've handled student mental health this year: a committee of the LSA was created and tasking with running programs, and rather quickly the committee became strong enough to work independently. That committee now operates as a student group for law students. I believe other Faculty Associations can draw some similar tactics on supporting mental health in their faculties like this.



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I also met with the PERCS VP Academic, who started their term early December as PERCS has a different elections cycle than the SU. PERCS has a lot of great initiatives planned this year, from anxiety management workshops to research involvement sessions and a career fair with CAPS.

Finally, Governor Khan and Councilor Christensen have been working on a new change to Bylaw that impacts an FA's ability to advocate in opposition SU political policy. I'm glad that nothing has been finalized but we're still discussing how the Bylaw can best fit everyone's concerns. The most recent edition of the changes that were modified at Bylaw are coming to COFA Senior Board for discussion this week.

6. Transition

My first job shadow day went really well, and I'm glad that the three members who attended found the day insightful and became a bit more passionate about the issues and items our SU pursues on a day to day basis. I've got three people signed up for my next job shadow day on Thursday, February 4th so far.

7. Miscellany

Campus Saint Jean had a great event over at the Fac a few weeks ago that a few of the SU Executives were able to attend. I was a delegate of the SU for the Vice President Search Thank You Reception party, which celebrated the hard work of the search committees that appointed a new Provost and VP Advancement. I also attended the ALES International Day which welcomed international students to our campus, and spoke of some of the services the SU provides that may be of interest to international students.

I had an interview with the Gateway equivalent at Ryerson University about what mental health services should ideally look like. Our General Manager and I met with the Director for the Peter Lougheed Leadership College to see what role the SU has in providing potential stretch experiences for PLLC students, while also refining their consultative framework with PLLC students until a representative association has been created. The SU Executive met with the Executive Director of the Alumni Association, and we may be working together on future renovations to the Powerplant. VP Kwan organized a great dinner between the SU Executive and the Council of Residence Associations. The SU Executive also had a meeting over dinner with StudentCare, who manages our health and dental plan.

GENDER OPTIONS ON APPLICATIONS

While this is only the first step in an expected series of changes to the way the Registrar tracks gender and gender identity with students through applications and BearTracks, it is important nonetheless. GENDERED LANGUAGE MEETING

This week also happened to be my meeting with a group of University staff from across the institution around gendered language. Representatives from the Faculty of Arts, Office of Safe Disclosure and Human Rights, Student Conduct and Accountability, Office of the Provost, and Office of the Registrar were in attendance, and we discussed language in the Code of Student Behaviour, the University Calendar, and a style guide for the University with formal rules around inclusive language. Once the applicable committees decide if these language changes to the Code and Calendar are editorial or substantive, we will be well on the way to getting them approved for use.

HEALTH AND DENTAL PLAN CHANGE-OF-COVERAGE PERIOD

This week, the Health and Dental Plan Committee voted to extend the change-of-coverage period (frequently called the "opt out deadline") for our student health and dental plan. Previously, the deadline lined up with the add/drop deadline for classes (September 15 this year), but we have extended it to be the last Wednesday of September each year, to allow students more time in choosing how to use the plan or opt-out if they have alternative coverage, and make the date closer to when fees are due. Students who begin their studies in January will have until the last Wednesday in January to change their coverage.



DFU PLEBISCITES IN ELECTIONS

This year we will have the first Dedicated Fee Unit up for a plebiscite in the General Election, and by random assignment, it is The Gateway. Every five years, all DFUs must go through a renewal process by way of a non-binding plebiscite, to show Council that the service still has the confidence of the students to assess a fee on their behalf. As DFUs can only be amended or abolished by referendum or joint consent of Council and whichever Board oversees a particular DFU, after elections are over a motion will be brought to the floor with the recommendation of Finance Committee (the committee taking into account the results of the plebiscite). Either a motion will be made to continue assessing the fee, or a motion will be made to compel the service to a binding referendum in the next General Election.

VPOF RETREAT

I went down to Calgary last week for a two-day retreat with my fellow Vice Presidents Operations and Finance from MacEwan University and the University of Calgary. We spent time catching up, and also talking about different issues facing our unions this year. I learned some awesome things from touring Calgary's conference centre, and also got some valuable information about staff structures across the organizations.
