WHEREAS student evaluation of teaching provides students with a voice in their learning environment and can help instructors improve their teaching;

WHEREAS excellence in undergraduate instruction promotes continuing educational endeavours by undergraduate students into higher levels of study;

WHEREAS initiatives designed to improve teaching make positive contributions to common teaching and learning practice as well as legislation relating to the governance of teaching and learning;

WHEREAS development of a culture that promotes excellence in teaching requires funding, attention and innovation on the part of the University;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Students' Union advocates for more activities that enhance the instructional quality for undergraduates and increased teaching professional development activities, including those that enhance communication skills;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Students' Union advocates that instructors are required to present evidence of their current and past teaching professional development experience as part of their annual review; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Students' Union fosters conditions that promote the importance of teaching at an institutional level; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Students' Union advocate for increased communication between students and professors through informal mid-semester feedback; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Students' Union advocate for a more effective student teaching evaluation mechanism and whose results are psychometrically valid and are made readily available for students

Hello Council,

Below you'll find an update of my activities from the past two weeks.

I. Be Book Smart

The SU is planning on reaching out to students at the start of the year with a "Be Book Smart" campaign. The campaign, which will be centred in SUB, is intended to get students thinking about alternatives to buying their textbooks new. I've been working closely with our marketing and communications departments on these plans.

II. Student Experience Survey

I've drafted a set of approximately 60 questions to ask University of Alberta students as part of a survey commissioned through Research and Evaluation Services. Topics covered include finances, teaching quality, and extra-curricular involvement, and will be used as part of our ongoing advocacy efforts. It should be administered in the early Fall semester.

III. Student Connect Soft Launch

The Registrar's Office has launched its new service model called "Student Connect". This brings many administrative tasks such as transcripts and admissions advising to a one-stop shop. The new model is currently struggling with long wait times, so they have initiated a hiring process for more front-line staff.

IV. Miscellaneous

I'm attending the Student Union Development Summit at UBC, I attended a presentation by the Office of Safe Disclosure and Human Rights, and a meeting of the Student Financial Aid Task Force. Finally, I've been involved in a number of internal SU meetings surrounding the University's budget.

Hello Council,

I'm writing this on Wednesday evening before I leave for the SUDSummit tomorrow afternoon. I promised an early report, so here it is! Without further ado:

SUB Renovation

Phase 1 of the storm line relocation began the preparatory work and will begin soon. The towers are nearing completion. I got a tour of the 3rd and 6th floor earlier this week and it's amazing to see the fruits of our labour. The 4th floor is slated for completion by August 19. The entire tower will be ready to be occupied by the end of September. There have been several challenges to get everything complete on time. The interior (lower level) will be finished by the end of June 2014 and the exterior (south facing wall and plaza) will be complete by late Fall 2014.

The Daily Grind

The coffee supplier's chosen! I will reveal the results soon. In the meantime, I got a glimpse of The Daily Grind's menu. It looks very promising and I'm excited for it to launch.

North Power Plant

I completed the first draft of the North Power Plant visioning/discussion document. It's going through more revisions with a few sets of eyes. I will report back when there's more to discuss.

Golden Bear and Panda Legacy Fund

GAC had a fruitful meeting and we made a motion to release the 2012/2013 GBPLF. I signed the cheque tonight and they should be receiving it shortly. The process going forward is refining the Letter of Expectation, implementing the process for the 2013/2014 Legacy Fund in the Fall, and then following through the 2014/2015 Legacy Fund in February/March go get back on the proper schedule.

Interdepartmental Science Students' Society Loan Agreement

The SU worked out a loan agreement between the ISSS for \$10,000 to cover a timing error of their Procedures Manual. This loan will allow them to fulfill an agreement with their Department Associations this year, and VP Chelen will help them adjust their PM next year to reflect the disbursal timing of the Audit Committee. The money will be repaid by deducting the amount from their FAMF disbursal.



Augustana Students' Association Campus Association Transfer Payment

I met with members of the ASA: Jame Vy, President, Shaun Dubash, VP (Finance), and VP (Academic)/Councillor Stephanie Gruhlke; to negotiate their CATP. I'm very impressed by their organizational structure and independence due to their location in Camrose/Augustana. We agreed to the same terms as outlined in Bylaw 8200 Section 32: The percentage of the Students' Union membership fee transferred to the Campus Association shall be determined by dividing the net Political/Governance spending of the Students' Union by the net Students' Union membership fees collected; then multiplying this number by one hundred; then subtracting this number from one hundred.

Student Union Development Summit

The Exec are attending the SUDSummit at the UBC Point Grey Campus (Vancouver) from Thursday to Sunday. The conference's unique mandate is to provide Students' Unions across the country with programming based on the exchange of ideas, tailored to the needs of the attending universities. The theme is 'The Future of the Student Unions.'' Programming will range from hands on, skills sharing workshops to discussions on the broader mandates of the SUs in Canada. My goal is to meet other VPOFs to develop a network to share best practices across organizations for the benefit of each individual Students' Union.

Hello Council,

How are you? I'm doing fine, thank you. Actually, I'm on a plane to Vancouver right now with Vice Presidents Chelen, Le, and Woods as I am writing this report. I know what you're thinking, but I assure you that our time away from the office will still be spent working for students!

I. Programming

Athletics

The tailgate party for the Golden Bear' Hockey team on Saturday, September 21st is still in the works. Unfortunately, the tailgate party for the Golden Bears' Football team on Saturday, September 7th will probably not happen. However, if the Football team gets back to us soon, maybe we could help promote the game via distribution of tickets throughout Week of Welcome!

Week of Welcome

The only update I have is surrounding a change in language re: what used to be called the "Beer Gardens". As an effort to take away the attention from what seemed to be an alcohol-driven event, the area encompassing the bands and the beverages will be labeled as "Main Stage";)

Again, councillors have been invited to come out to volunteer for the Pancake Breakfasts and only those that register will receive a limited edition WoW T-shirt. If you want to vote on what will be printed on the T-shirt, please visit the Students' Council Facebook page.

Winter Programming

Last Council Report, I mentioned hopes to have one additional large-scale event before Break The Record... it *might* look like a talent/variety show;)

II. Services

International Student Mentorship

Although this is not an actual SU Service, I want to put out the message that Vice-President Chelen and I are currently recruiting domestic students that are interested in mentoring international students later on this academic year.



III. Advocacy

U-Pass

In last week's meeting with ETS Security and Municipal Prosecutors, I learned that U-Pass related failure to provide proof of payment is brought to the courthouse roughly once a week. City personnel has made a request for 1) an increased effort to raise awareness among students surrounding carrying their U-Pass, and 2) statistics around the frequency of U-Pass violations, so that they could better illustrate what procedural changes would look like as they are being considered. In the meantime, the Municipal Prosecutors will be working on a written response to us surrounding the issue (no specified timeline).

Otherwise, Sherwood Park Transit has been having a few changes. They are currently building a new bus terminal to accommodate more (1200) parking stalls. In September, they will be in a state of transition which will need to be communicated to students. We will support the efforts as we receive updates. Additionally, they will have a double decker bus running in September as well!

Residence

The review of the Residence Community Standards (aka discipline process) will probably wrap up within the next month. Although the restorative justice process is a theoretically sound process, President Kusmu and I are working on ensuring that fair processes (ex, transparency to involved students) are written in policy. In the longer term, we will be working towards codifying the lease process under which evictions from residence occur. The current system is not understood by many, and is broad to allow flexibility and for residence staff to treat cases individually. However, we feel that some clarification is necessary surrounding what could result in eviction, and how those decisions could be appealed.

Re: Report to Policy (for August 6th meeting)

Hello Policy,

I've had a very busy couple of weeks so far as lobbying and government relations go. Here's all you need to be updates on:

Public Interest Alberta:

On July the 25th a group known as Public Interest Alberta (PIA) held a meeting between the CAUS, the GSA, the U of A Non-Academic Staff Association, and ASEC. PIA is an interest group that directs public attention towards issues that directly affect the public. For example, they are currently running a campaign on the state of senior citizens in Alberta. Education obviously being public issue, PSE is one of the areas PIA regularly contributes in.

At the meeting we had a discussion over each organizations priorities for the year. The grads, ASEC, and CAUS all agreed that the PSLA was the largest area of concern for the upcoming year and that issues like fees, tuition, and student representation should be topics addressed in the act. It was an excellent opportunity to relay our message, and even better that there was agreement between us and other organizations. Should the UASU hold an MNIF awareness campaign, it would be very helpful to get PIA on our side.

Student Financial Aid Orientation:

On Monday the 29th myself and other delegates from CAUS, ASEC, and AGC took part in Student Financial Aid Orientation with the government group that advises the Deputy Premier on the state of student aid. It was a good opportunity to refresh memories on how the specific mechanics of student financial aid works, as well as an opportunity to express concerns with the current system.

Concerns such as the hardships on married students to receive loans, regularly updating loan weekly loan amounts to reflect CPI, and putting more money into non-refundable aid were the top concerns brought up by all at the table. With that being said, we also iterated our pleasure at parental income, vehicles and RSSP's now being exempted from expected contributions. Overall it was a very good meeting.

The Quarterly Meeting:

The following day we had our first quarterly meeting with the Deputy Premier and the Ministry of Advanced Education and Enterprise. It was a very productive day in which we had the opportunity to discuss timelines and some issues that will be important to us in the upcoming year.

First and foremost, it sounds as if the majority of the consultation and decision making will be held between October and February of this upcoming year, which gives us a good amount of time in order

to prepare our specific asks for the next quarterly meeting. The Deputy Premier made it clear that students would be given a good opportunity to provide input and effect change in both the PSLA and Campus Alberta. This is a promise we are optimistic the government will keep, and we will do our best to keep them accountable to our participation.

The only specific issue that brought up surrounded student participation in the Board of Governors. This has been a discussion receiving a fair amount of attention in the past few days, which is very helpful for our cause.

There are many examples around Alberta of students not being treated as equal board members in University governance, not receiving the same documentation, and even being asked to leave the room when discussion surrounding tuition and fees are brought up. The Minister committed to creating a PSE system where students are considered equal stakeholders, and we look forward to providing our input and working together with the government to make this a reality.

Lobby Meetings:

As I mentioned earlier in the report, I have begun sending out communications to MLA's and MP's in hopes of receiving lobby meetings. So far this has been successful and I have received several responses. I had the opportunity to meet with Matt Jeneroux (MLA Edmonton-Southwest) to discuss CAUS's priorities for the upcoming year. The meeting was very productive, and Mr. Jeneroux was very receptive to all issues raised ranging from the PSLA, non-refundable student aid, and student employment. We are optimistic that Mr. Jeneroux will raise these issues with the government.

In other lobby news, I have also booked meeting with Speaker Gene Zwozdesky (MLA Edmonton-Mill Creek), Naresh Bhardwaj (MLA Edmonton-Millwoods) and Sohail Quadri (Edmonton-Ellerslie). I am very happy to finally get the ball rolling on lobby meetings and will provide more updates as they come.
