Some updates:

- Last meeting, the VPs also gave the committee a status update on the progress of the political policy implementation plans that were set out in the summer. The exercise proved to be useful, as it gave committee members the opportunity to track the activities of the Exec.

- Still waiting on the Academic Materials political policy to be drafted, though Bobby has assured me that it will be ready for the next UPC meeting.

GOALS:

Enhance Technology - more to come.

Improve Teaching — We met with AASUA to discuss faculty development and how to incorporate teaching in there. This will probably be a discussion point of GFC Committee on the Learning Environment (CLE) along with student evaluations.

Increase Bursaries - I met with Gerry Kendal, the interim
Registrar, to discuss scholarships and obtaining data.

Reward Involvement — So out of the 10 volunteer groups that we contacted, only one expressed interest in obtaining CSL credit. Currently, we are working on trying to raise the profile of CSL to implement the "Involvement" political policy.

EMERGING ISSUES:

Exam Registry — The letter should be sent out soon, currently in the process of gathering numbers.

Online Fees — This is getting more attention as an issue from both administration and students. Currently, we are "tasked" with identifying cases of students paying online fees for graded assignments.

Augustana Visit — The Exec ventured to Augustana campus in Camrose. We got a tour and discussed various issues that were coming up.

General Faculties Council (GFC) — There were two committees, ASC SOS and Exec. Currently, we're trying to deal with a new Practicum Intervention Policy that gives Deans the power to withdraw students from their practicums, currently we still do not feel students' rights are being met and continue to advocate for students on this issue.

Faculty Associations (FAs) — We are working on offering some services to FAs in order to make their lives easier as executives. Currently, we are gathering data to find out costs. As well, we met with AUFSJ and in the next couple of weeks, I hope to meet as many of the FAs as possible.
