VILLOSO: Inquired as to whether Kimani has plans to meet with Augustana student representatives soon.

Suggested that, given that EDIT has low levels of participation and engagement last year, Nominating Committee should have responsibility for holding interviews. #### Hello Council,

I hope you are all doing well and if you are in Canada, that you have either been vaccinated or have made plans to be! I was so happy to receive my first shot of Moderna, which is of course the Dolly Parton vaccine and therefore the coolest (but get whatever vaccine is available to you). While there is still a lot of uncertainty about where the next stage of the pandemic will go, and I, like many of you, am worried that we are not out of the woods yet, getting your shot is absolutely essential. You can book a vaccine in our very own Students' Union Building on the <u>University Health Centre Website</u>. High vaccination rates in students are essential for a safe return to campus and we all need to do our part to get that number as high as possible.



#### **Exceptional Tuition Increase Proposals**

In the last two weeks, the faculties proposing exceptional tuition increases have been wrapping up their consultation with students. The executive believes that the vast majority of these consultations have been inadequate and do not meet the basic requirements of the Tuition and Fees Regulation, <u>Student Participation and Process</u> <u>Handbook</u>, and best practices for procedural fairness. I have reached out to the Provost's Office to invite the University to present to Council on the exceptional increases, which has happened at the University of Calgary, but unfortunately I have received no reply as of writing this report. The inadequate consultation on such significant exceptional increases is unacceptable to the Students' Union and we are working on a series of actions in response. Further details will be available very soon. Once we finalize more details we will provide comprehensive information to Council, likely through a presentation at our next meeting. I want you all to know that the executive is taking this file very seriously and is putting considerable effort into our response.

#### **CASA Foundations Conference**


VP Fotang and I are attending the Canadian Alliance of Student Associations' annual Foundations conference online this week. Foundations is when we meet our



counterparts from coast to coast, learn about federal student advocacy, and elect a new Chair and Board. VP Fotang is running to be CASA's Director of Advocacy, a critical position which oversees our campaigns. This is particularly important in a year when we will likely see a federal election.

I am also pleased to report that our CASA family has been growing. We voted to admit the University of Manitoba Students' Union as a full member, adding 31,000 students to our membership. This contributes to stronger student advocacy by CASA, which is, as I

never miss a chance to point out, one of the most effective advocacy groups in Ottawa. Online conferences have been a little different in-person ones, with shorter days to accommodate time differences. If you're wondering what a week at an online conference is like, here's my calendar.



#### **Stakeholder Meetings and Relationships**

Myself and the other VPs have been working hard to establish relationships with our partners around the University. Just for some examples, by Council I will have met twice several faculty associations, including regular one-on-ones with the AUFSJ President, the University's Chief Strategy Officer, the non-Academic Staff Association, the Graduate Students' Association President, and Governor Konrad. Relationships are essential to the work we do here and fostering them is a significant part of our first few months in office.

I hope you are all doing well! These last couple of weeks have been busy, to say the least. Here is a brief breakdown of what I've been up to since our last council meeting:

#### NomCom Approved Job Postings for SAL Positions

Last week on Thursday, NomCom approved several student-at-large (SAL) job position postings for the following:

- Aboriginal Relations and Reconciliation Committee (ARRC)
- Student Group Committee
- University of Alberta Senate
- Sustainability Ad Hoc Committee
- Sustainability and Capital Fund Committee
- Translation Committee

These job postings will be open until June 4th, 2021, and they can also be found <u>HERE</u> if you want more info on each position. I ask that all of you please share this information with your friends and other groups on campus that you are a part of so that they know about these opportunities!

#### Met with the Provost, Vice Provost Learning Initiatives, and Vice Provost Programs

I met with Provost, Steve Dew, and Vice Provosts, John Nychka and Tammy Hopper, this week where I got to start some great discussions about my goals for the year. We discussed the implementation of some sort of Credit/Non-Credit Grading System to encourage interdisciplinarity on campus and ways to increase awareness of the Charter of Student Rights and Responsibilities so that students know the rights they have and responsibility they hold when attending the U of A.

#### Policy Committee Started Renewing Policy

Policy Committee has started to renew policies that are set to expire in April 2022. I'm currently working on the Experiential Learning Policy with Councillors Dhillon, Beasley, and Aamer and am excited to see what new ideas we can bring to the policy!

#### **Open Education Alberta Advocacy Group**

I had my first meeting with the Open Education Advocacy Group where I met many of my student counterparts and other individuals who are very involved in open education across other post-secondary institutions in Alberta. It was great to hear what other institutions are up to and what areas we as an institution need to advance.

#### Met with Student Representative Associations (SRAs)

I've gotten the chance now to meet with several SRAs to have introductory meetings, talk about shared and individual goals, and the ways to maintain SU/SRA relationships and communication as we embark on this next academic year. This week I met with the following:

- Law Students' Association, President
- Business Students' Association, President
- Alberta Pharmacy Students' Association, President
- Engineering Students' Society, President
- International Students' Association, VP Academic

I'm looking forward to working with our student leaders and strengthening our relationship going forward. I'll also note that some of these meetings will be between Friday and Students' Council.

#### Student Evaluation of Teaching and Learning Task Force

Last year the Vice Provost of Learning Initiatives, John Nychka, struck a task force to look at the student evaluation of teaching and learning. Much of the work of this task force looked at the USRIs and improving their functionality and reporting system for students and faculty. I was privileged to sit on this task force alongside David Draper (past SU VPA), and that work has now carried over into this term. We wrapped up last week when the task force completed our draft report/recommendations which will be coming to GFC in the fall. I have fought hard to ensure students continue to have a strong avenue to shape their learning in the classroom and can see their feedback acknowledged and hopefully implemented in the course they are taking.

#### Action Items

- I am meeting with the Office of the Registrar today (Friday) to get an update on the Zero Textbook Cost Signifier Program that Councillor Batycki inquired about at the last meeting. I should have an update for Council on Tuesday.

I hope you have all been taking good care of yourselves, staying safe and enjoying your summer. A significant portion of my week was spent at the Canadian Alliance of Students Association (CASA) Foundation Conference.

#### **CASA** Foundations

President Ley and I participated in the CASA Foundations conference all of last week. This four day event increased my knowledge of the history, work and structure of CASA. Additionally this conference, although virtual, still enabled me to: connect with our 23 other members SU/SA from across the nation; improved my cultural competency and bystander intervention skills via beneficial training sessions; and increased my knowledge of CASA's policy and advocacy process. It was also important to hear from other SU/SAs about the issues they currently face and their priorities for the year. We also welcomed the University of Manitoba Students' Union (UMSU) as our newest member. We are excited about the expansion of more members to our Federal family and see this as a recognition of the work and advocacy CASA delivers. .

On the last day of this conference, May 28th, we shall elect the new Chair of CASA as well as the new members of the Board of Directors. I will have more updates for you at our council meeting this coming Tuesday!

#### Alberta's Open For Summer Plan

The Premier announced a couple days ago on the Province's <u>three stage plan</u> that will have the province's major health restrictions lifted come early July. Post Secondary is expected to resume in person come Mid-June. I encourage you all to continue to stay safe and get your vaccines if you haven't done so already!



#### Notable meetings

#### **AUFSJ VPX Counterpart**

I met with AUFSJ VP External Chiara Concini to discuss ways the UASU can assist AUFSJ in the campaign to save Campus Saint-Jean. We discussed the larger role the UASU can play in providing messages of support, increasing our social media activity on the issue, and assisting AUFSJ In building more networks across the country through avenues like CASA and the UEQ. Dear Council,

Hello again! Happy to be seeing everyone. I cannot believe we are at the end of May; time is passing by quickly. I hope you have all taken some time to go outside, enjoy the sun, and soak in some Vitamin D. I, for one, have been on many, many walks while I listen to the Michelle Obama Podcast. Does anyone have any podcast recommendations??

These past two weeks have been busy as we move further along into our roles. I took over the Executive Instagram last week, which was exciting! The purpose of these takeovers is to ensure that we are communicating and being transparent with students. As well as giving a "behind the scenes" look into being an Executive. Each Executive will have a chance to take over the Instagram page and take you along their day; stay tuned.

I have now met with all the core managers and have begun to draft out and plan some of my projects for this year, like Aboriginal Awareness Week, recognizing Black History Month at the UASU, and implementing the bulk foods section in SUBmart. Things are still relatively preliminary but I will keep you updated as we move through the year.

#### **Business and Operations Update**

SUB will remain open during the remaining spring and summer months with its current operating hours. The Daily Grind and SUBmart will operate as per usual and are ready to serve our campus community. SUBprint is operating only through pick-up orders at the moment. Deweys, unfortunately, will remain closed during the spring and summer months but will open back up in the Fall. RATT will also remain closed until the Fall, where it will then be available as a space that student groups can book for events. Although we are in the early stages, and with the recent announcement from the government, we are in the process of ramping up our operations to ensure that we are ready when students return to campus. This will be especially important as we approach August and the beginning of September.

#### <u>UPass Update</u>

Along with other student leaders, I have a seat on the UPass Working Committee and the UPass Administration Committee. As you know, the UPass successfully passed at the referendum this past March, and so, it was renewed. After hard advocacy from last year's Executive, the UPass will cost University of Alberta undergraduate students \$180 per semester for the years 2021-2025. The negotiated agreement will see no fee increase for the entire 4-year contract. Now, we are in the process of finalizing and signing the agreement. We are also transitioning over to SmartFare. Although still in the beginning stages, we have started to have conversations regarding SmartFare and SmartCard distribution. I hope to have further updates on SmartFare soon.

#### StudentCare Stakeholder Conference

VP Dixon and I attended the StudentCare Stakeholder Conference this week. We were asked to give a Land Acknowledgement at the beginning of the conference. The conference is held to bring together student leaders from across the country to learn from industry experts, provide feedback on Studentcare's innovations, and contribute to the development of student healthcare. We attended a series of incredible talks and presentations that focused on the health and wellness of students. It was also a great opportunity to meet and network with other student leaders.

#### Sustainability Projects

#### Menstrual Hygiene Day

The Period Poverty initiative has been a major priority for VP Dixon and I. We have continued to work out our plan for the year. Specifically, we have focused on bringing awareness and providing education to this initiative by celebrating Menstrual Hygiene Day on May 28th! You may have seen our post about Menstrual Hygiene Day on the UASU Instagram page. VP Dixon and I were interviewed by CBC this week about our plans to expand the Period Poverty Initiative and the ways in which, as a campus, we can move towards menstrual equity. The interview aired Friday morning!

#### SCF Green Fund

We have recently hired a Funding and Awards specialist who I have been closely working with to oversee the SCF Green Fund distribution. This way, we can ensure that we have a consistent process for the allocation and distribution of the fund moving forward.

#### **Noteworthy Meetings**

#### **GFC Facilities Development Committee**

This committee reviews and recommends general space and functional programs, the design and use of facilities, and policies related to facilities and planning. In our last meeting, we discussed the DentPharm project and approved the building programming.

#### World University Services Canada (WUSC)

I had a meeting with WUSC last week to discuss the Refugee Board and their plans for the year. WUSC is a dedicated fee unit, which will be going to referendum this year, through which an international student is sponsored through financial aid to study at Campus Saint Jean or at North Campus.

#### Gateway Student Journalism Society (GSJS) Board

I attended my first GSJS meeting this week. We appointed members to various committees and discussed the committee's plans for the year.

Lastly, I would like to remind you all that EDIT applications are still <u>live</u>. I encourage you all to apply and spread the word. Applications close June 15th.

#### Hi Council,

Happy Gemini season! The past two weeks have been very busy but I feel like I'm settling into the role. Here are some of the more exciting things that I have been working on:

#### The Return to Campus

I sit on two committees that have spoken at length about the return to campus. The RTC Safety and Logistics Committee for Fall 2021 and the Fall Readiness Committee for Student Services and Experience Working Group. Both of these committees are pretty high level and are dealing with a myriad of issues. Right now it looks like there will be a mix of in-person and online events and services to accommodate for the fact that some students might not be back on campus. Services will also open up in early to mid-august. We are also trying to figure out how students can have a space to attend meetings, class, and jobs that are still online. I want these committees to address students concerns in advance, so if you have any, please let me know!

#### The Ring House Coalition

The Ring House Coalition is a group of academics, architects, heritage organizations and interested citizens working to protect the historic University of Alberta Ring Houses. We meet every week; it's very rewarding to learn about these houses and work with the collective to protect these buildings. You can (dare I say should) sign their petition here <u>https://bit.ly/3yTECSS</u>.

#### Residence

Things are ramping up in terms of residence. We've had our first JROC and RAC committee meetings. We discussed the residence program initiatives that are being planned at all campuses, we got an update on occupancy, learned more about the isolation accommodation program and much more. I am hoping to have the first meeting of CORA next week. I also met with Alison Exner to talk about the Residence Community Standards policy. Finally, I am working with the AUFSJ president to tackle CSJ specific concerns.

#### Transit and the UPass

As a minor update, VP Kimani and I have been working with our staff to sort out UPASS distribution. We also had a meeting with Free Transit Edmonton to learn more about their work and how they see it impacting students.

#### The Pronoun Campaign

I have been working with the Landing and marketing to create the pronoun campaign as outlined in my platform. This project will educate students, staff, and faculty about what pronouns are, how to use them, and the importance of not assuming an individual's pronouns. I hope that this campaign will start in the fall and help make campus a safer space for all students.

#### Sexual Violence

I have met with the Sexual Assult Center, relevant uni admin/staff and our marketing staff to create more supports for survivors via social media. #### **Standard Meetings**

- 1. Board of Governors (BoG): for those who heard my report at last Council meeting, this will be repeated content, but some recipients of this form are not part of Students' Council. At the last meeting our new Board bylaws were adjusted to include a diversity statement in the recruitment section, which I raised the need for. We also discussed how to incentivize anti-vaxxers to get vaccinated if they will be on campus. Preliminary ideas were considered about how UAlberta can utilize online programming to attract more students post-COVID. We also talked about UAlberta for Tomorrow and UAlberta's government relations strategy.
- 2. Board Governance Committee (BGC): we took the Board's recommendations from the meeting above, regarding the bylaws, and discussed a close-to-final version of them. We also touched on committee efficiency as a broad topic across all Board committees. Notably, we had a phenomenal presentation on EDI in recruitment by the Senior Equity and Human Rights Advisor from the Provost's Office, after which I asked about what striking a good long term demographic parity goal could look like and what first steps could be for our committee if we were interested in reviewing our definition of competency. The presentation was to refresh members on EDI priorities as we looked at an initial draft of a recruitment framework for Board committees. This framework is important because recruitment has been too informal up to this point. We also discussed internal Board performance, our strategic retreat and our relationship with General Faculties Council.

Lucas Marques UASU Chief Returning Officer Suggestion 1: A review of bylaw 6100 regarding the amendment of a plebiscite question that renews a DFU after it has already been sent and approved.

- Bylaw 6100 has no information regarding the amendment of plebiscite/referendum questions once they have been submitted and approved.
- The DIE board recommended January 2021 a thorough review and simplification of bylaws 1500 and 6100, having in mind the role that bylaw 2500 plays in setting the rules and protecting the election process as a whole.

Suggestion: Allow for Plebiscite questions to be amended after they have been approved, as long as they are reviewed 30 Days prior to the General Election. After this deadline, amendments can only be made if and only if the issue is a result of a failure from the Bylaw Committee to create a plebiscite question that fulfills the original proposal.

Suggestion 2: Resolve the issue of Candidates being able to endorse each other related to the direct contradiction with Bylaw 2200, Section 24(1) and Bylaw 2300, Section 22(1).

- Important to highlight that in this decision, the DIE board only used bylaw 2300 which regulates the legislation to Council and GFC Elections.
- Bylaw 2200 regulates Executive elections legislation.

Suggestion: Council must discuss if candidates in either elections are allowed to not only endorse each other but also share resources such as having the same person in an instagram video for instance. And there can be two possible outcomes:

- Council agrees that candidates are allowed to endorse each other and share resources, therefore bylaws 2200 and 2300 must make sure that it reflects such purpose. It must make sure that resources such as pictures and videos of the same people that support each different candidate are not considered collusion or any other form of shared resource. Sections 21 and 22 of bylaw 2300 must make that clear.
- Council agrees that candidates are not allowed to endorse each other and share resources such as videos and pictures of volunteers that endorse different candidates.
   Sections 21 and 22 of bylaw 2300 must make that clear.

I would also like to make a further suggestion that even though Bylaws 2200 and 2300 are regarding different types of elections (Executive and Council), they should reflect the same basic rules and understandings.

Suggestion 3: If the number of open Council and GFC seats is equal or less than 5 open positions per Council AND if the CRO considers it necessary, the SU Council should initiate the Vacancy Petition of Bylawy 100 without having to hold a fall by-election.

- I believe that in this case, Council should benefit from having a full student composition prior to the beginning of the Fall semester as it would allow council to fulfill its duties more effectively.
- In past years, having a by-election did not necessarily mean filling out all the seats. Most times, a couple of seats would still be vacant after the by-election.

Suggestion: Amend bylaw 2400 to include a clause that states that council can approve the appointment of members to assume vacant seats, given that there are 5 or less seats available and that the CRO considers it necessary to, without the need of having a Fall by-election.
