It is with a heavy heart that I write my final and last Council Report as UASU President, and after completing three years on Students' Council. My time with the Student's Union has been enriching, eye opening and a time of great learning and growth.

About one year ago, the University of Alberta announced cancellation of in person classes due to COVID-19 in light of health measures received from the Provincial Government. This pandemic has been the greatest crisis we have faced as an organization outside of wartime in our 112-year existence. No doubt it has posed a great threat to the campus body, campus life, health and safety, academic quality and morale.

For the past year, the Executive team has needed to shift much of our regular functions and advocacy to ensure adequate capacity in dealing with the additional pressures of this pandemic. Throughout the year, I engaged in weekly university COVID-19 update meetings where student concerns were brought on a consistent basis regarding health and safety, online learning challenges, mental health concerns, international student issues among others.

Though the year has been a challenging one, I am grateful for the opportunity to serve the student body at a time as such.

I will be releasing a fulsome reflection of this unprecedented year in student governance at a later point.

Thank you for allowing me to serve as your University of Alberta Students' Union President for the 2020/2021 academic year. It has been a deep honour.

Re: Vice President Academic 2020/21 Report #23

This is looking to be the final report of my term as Vice President Academic. I would like to extend my sincere thanks to all of the students who trusted me to serve them in this position. I can truly attest that I will be leaving this role in good hands. In light of this being my final report I have outlined my successes in regards to my platform points below.

Making University More Affordable

Reducing reliance on High Cost Textbooks Through Open Educational Resources

- Ensured discussions around open education were at the forefront when talking about academic materials during the planning for Fall 2020
- Co-authored an Op-Ed about the importance of OER for students in the Edmonton Journal, the article received strong uptake.
- Filmed a series of lunch and learn videos for students interested in getting involved in OER advocacy
- Co-Authored the first ever UASU Open Education Policy
- Successfully advocated for the creation of a Zero Textbook Cost Signifier Program, which is set to launch in August 2021.

Advocating for more Needs-Based Awards and Scholarships

- Worked with the Registrar's Office around financial aid during the SET initiative. Discussed moving awards applications centrally to increase the accessibility of applications for students. This change saves students time and may award them scholarship money they were unaware they were eligible for.
- Discussed with the Registrar's Office the importance of the Access fund as a needs based system.

Push for Open, Accessible, and Equitable Experiential learning Opportunities

- Worked with VPSL Katie Kidd to develop a presentation on the policy gaps existing in WIL at the University of Alberta. We then presented on these policy gaps to the GFC Committee on the Learning Environment, The Council on Student Affairs, and the Programs Committee.
- After the presentations individuals on the various committees had a broader understanding of the policy gaps as well as the need for more protections for students on practica.
- We are now working with the Provost's Portfolio Initiatives manager as well as the GFC
 Secretary to begin the drafting process of a new UAPPOL policy with explicit protections for
 students on practica.

Advocating for Student Needs

Weekend Midterms

- Within the UASU Assessment and Grading Policy there is now a fact regarding the inequities of weekend assessments and a resolution binding future UASU members to advocate for alternatives to the use of weekend midterms.
- Due to the Covid-19 pandemic the other discussions around exam equity took the forefront, most directly Online Proctoring and Asynchronous Assessments.
- I have raised issues of Online Proctoring and Asynchronous assessments to every committee of the General Faculties Council of which I am a member, as well as to any member of the University leadership whom I have met.
- I have beene in print media, live radio, television news and other forms of media multiple times talking about the issues of online proctoring, at local, national and international scales.
- Currently I am serving on the Provost's Task Force for Remote Learning Online Proctoring Working Group where I have worked on the development of a policy surrounding the use of online proctoring which is currently undergoing consultation prior to its implementation.

Increasing Access to Accommodations and Course Descriptions

- Advocated for additional functionalities within the enrollment software to allow students to gather more information about their courses. This function was later added to the new version of Beartracks and currently some work is underway around categorizing courses via theme to add additional search functionality.
- Advocated tirelessly for the university to respect accommodations of students during the online terms as many remote teaching strategies unfairly disadvantaged students with accommodations.

Reducing Barriers to Representation

- Worked on the Governance Restructuring Task Force to look at various barriers to success within governance for Students' Council and for Student Representative Associations and proposed solutions.
- Added Micro-Credentialing to Student Leaders Week / Alberta Student Leader Summit in order to provide attendees with tangible credentials to verify their skills.
- Working on the GFC Ad Hoc Procedural Review Committee to formalize the ability to virtually attend meetings in order to remove the need to be physically on North Campus to participate.
- Worked with the Registrar's Office to change the use of the term "other" for gender declaration during applications.
- Fought Transphobia at the General Faculties Council
- Actively worked to normalize queer expression within governance spaces across campus.



Revitalize the Student Movement on The General Faculties Council

Reframe Student Perception of GFC

- Highlighted the importance of involvement in GFC as well as the impact of the decisions made there.
- Encouraged students to take charge and actively engage during their time on GFC
- Emphasized that students have very real and tangible authority / power while serving on GFC
- Worked to ensure that people understand the importance of and the role of student involvement on GFC.
- Success in this work can be seen through the dramatic increases in student engagement with GFC over my tenure. Looking at the election results for the Students Council / GFC elections over the past 3 years students seeking election to GFC has dramatically increased.

Work with Faculty Associations to fill all vacant positions

- For the first time in University of Alberta history all of the undergraduate student seats on GFC have been filled.
- This unprecedented achievement showcases that students are willing to engage and take charge of their academic success
- I firmly believe that this record sets a new standard for future Vice Presidents Academic to follow.

Lead an Organized Student Caucus.

- Drafted a GFC handbook which outlines important information such as committee mandates, meeting procedures, individuals who serve on GFC as well as constructive materials such as worksheets for drafting effective questions, guides for effective participation.
- Worked with the GFC governance team to organize an early orientation for new members of GFC to fulsomely explain the committee structures, mandates, and time commitments so that they can form educated applications for committee positions.
- Held frank and open conversations prior to GFC meetings where students were able to ask questions and provide context on the various items on GFC agendas. I actively ensured that these meetings were not prescriptive of opinion but rather only a place to provide context and discuss / workshop any questions in order to build confidence in participation.

Once again, to all the students who put their trust in me for this year, thank you. I truly did everything within my power to make all of our lives easier where I could.

Dear Council,

I can't believe it, but this is my final report. It has been an honour and a journey to serve as your Vice-President of Operations & Finance. I would like to use this opportunity to document an overview of some of the projects I have gotten to work on this year. So much of the work I have done this year was not started by me, and there is much that will be carried on. Time ran out for a few important projects, and the pandemic prevented others; but there is also a lot that I am proud to have worked on. So here is a non-exhaustive list of things that happened this year that touched my portfolio:

U-Pass

- An historic deal achieved at negotiations for the first time ever, we have a four year price freeze at the current price.
- Despite the U-Pass being unavailable due to the pandemic, secured affordable alternatives for students living in the Edmonton area.
- U-Pass passed with 86% in favour at referendum, so we will have it back soon!

Businesses

- Our businesses slowed down because of COVID, with most students working from home.
- We had to make difficult decisions, such as closing Dewey's from January 2021 through September 2021.
- We took this as an opportunity to think strategically about our businesses post-pandemic, and are currently setting ourselves up for success.

Building

- SUB remained open throughout this year, and was one of few buildings on campus to do so.
 We wanted students to have a place where they could study, even if their home environment wasn't compatible.
- Our staff did an excellent job at increasing our already high standard of cleanliness in our building.

Sustainability & Capital Fund

- 13 students created thorough assessment tools for major sustainability capital projects, ensuring that SU capital projects will be valuable to students.
- By establishing the Green Fund, student applicants can receive funding to make their sustainability dreams come true on campus.
- We are making significant sustainability improvements to SUB, beginning with a renewal of the Myer Horowitz Theatre, which will include a new elevator, solar panels, better water and energy efficiency, and much more.



Vice President Operations & Finance

Free Menstrual Products

- Using some sponsorship money that we raised, we put up our first free menstrual products dispenser! Check it out in SUB, outside the basement bathrooms.
- This is part of our efforts to achieve equity on campus and to mitigate period poverty.

Health & Dental Plan

 Implemented the new Basic Plan for health and dental insurance, which is a cost-effective alternative to our Comprehensive Plan, to increase the affordability and options of the insurance that we offer.

UASU Perks

 Has grown to a community of thousands of users, and enabled the SU to gain student perspectives on a variety of issues

I cannot write this without saying that none of this could have happened without the incredible staff at the Students' Union. Marc, Craig, Eric, and everyone else who I don't want to embarrass by naming in a report. Exceptional people are what make the UASU exceptional. I will miss every single one of them, and I will always be indebted to them for their support.

There is also so much that was done this year by the rest of the executive team. The advocacy and service that they have done for students this year has been immense. I am exceptionally proud of David Draper, Katie Kidd, Rowan Ley, and Joel Agarwal for their unwillingness to back down in the face of mountains standing against them. I haven't been here for long, but I would guess that there has never been a time when we have had to do so much, for so long, with so little.

Thank you to each Students' Councillor for your engagement, for taking initiative and deciding that you would be the one to make the change you wanted to see. I hope you will keep learning, keep engaging, and keep in touch.

This feels somewhat unreal, writing my last council report. This year in some respects has dragged on but also gone so fast. I am so proud of myself and my team for this year. We have worked so hard together and accomplished so much for students. It has been an honour and privilege to be your VP SL.

Sexual Violence Prevention Coordinator

This was my number one goal throughout the campaign and after being elected. After being recommended in 2016, and four years later I am so happy this is a reality. I have spent the whole year helping survivors who couldn't find the support they needed. I know how vital this role is.

Sexual Violence Website, UAPPOL and Sexual Violence on Experiential Learning

Other sexual violence iniatiatives from this year! We ran a survey for sexual violence on experiential learning, as I campaigned on. This found 10% of surveyed students had experienced sexual violence. We successfully advocated the University to update their sexual violence website. This made reporting pathways and resources more clear, and added a quick exit tab. We also advocated for adding clarifying documentation to the Conflict of Interest policy to clarify rules about relationships with profs. We also are working on an experiential learning UAPPOL policy which will be continued next year.

Mental Health: Empower Me

One of my key platform goals was working to diversify the SU's mental health services. To do this (and respond to the pandemic), I focused on launching Empower Me through the Health and Dental Plan. This provided mental wellness services at no additional cost to plan members. It is available 24/7, 365 days a year, confidential, multilingual, culturally sensitive, gender inclusive and faith inclusive. It is also available in 22 countries outside of Canada.

Residence: Meal Plan Rate Advocacy and Pride Sidewalks

This year CORA and I focused on advocating around the meal plan rates. We worked successfully with residence services to lower the meal plan rate by 200\$. This was a high priority for us and I am really proud of all the residence association presidents. We also worked through the Residence Improvement Fund to apply for Pride sidewalks. Three will be installed in the fall. One is funded through the Students' Union. I can't wait to see these on campus in the fall.





Vice President Student Life

Students Who Parent: Daycare

The UASU and GSA partnered with Kids & Company, to offer a daycare service to students. This service has numerous locations across Edmonton. It offers students 1-5 full day, part time and drop-in care. The drop-in care is low cost to meet students financial needs priced at \$50 a day for the first 10 days. Students will be guaranteed a placement in 6 months and there are extended hours available as well.

EDI

It became clear this year that the UASU needed to start doing more. I worked to create EDIT, who's survey about the SU services is out now. We also worked in collaboration with the ISA and Nigerian Students' Association to offer drop in supportive listening in response to their needs. We had the first two EDI Speaker Series. The first was "A Conversation with Angela Davis" and was hosted by Eternity Martis. The second was "Finding Identity: An LGBTQ2S+ Conversation on Intersectionality, Mental Health, and Allyship" and featured Ben O'Keefe, Jack Saddleback, Milan and Kat Blaque. Finally, we are hiring an EDI consultant to look at some of our internal processes.

Events

This year changed how we offered events with everything being online. Our events team did a great job at adapting as much programming as possible to be online, such as the trivia nights and escape rooms. We also had the Campus Kick Off Concert featuring Nina West, Lennon Stella, Pink Sweat\$, Roy Wood\$, A Tribe Called Red, Tyson Ritter (of The All-American Rejects) and The Reklaws. This was to try to have a virtual Res Fest/ WOW Concerts. Finally, as previously mentioned we started the Edi Speakers Series which I hope will continue in person!

I started volunteering for the Students' Union in my second year of University and now I end my fifth as Vice President SL. I would like to think second year me would be really proud of who I am and what I did this year. I am so grateful that I got to work with you all this year. I hope you are all proud of what you accomplished this year. I also hope you take the lessons you learned at the SU to go out and do good.

I am not very good at goodbyes. So I will leave you with my favourite Taylor Swift quote, "I had the time of my life fighting dragons with you"

Re: Budget Actions Debrief

The Story, In Brief

We lost at the March 12th Board Meeting at which UAlberta's annual budget was approved. The Board did not show any willingness to compromise on any rate increases and the Students' Union's (SU) President's recommendation to allocate 20% of excess tuition revenues to student financial aid was not seriously engaged with by anyone. This said, in our conversations with Board members leading up to the budget vote, they shared several good ideas for longer term advocacy.

My aim with this document is to give you the full picture of what your student advocates did, how the Board responded, and ask for your feedback regarding what should happen at next year's budget vote.

Questions for You

- 1. What did we as advocates do well?
- 2. What did we do poorly?
- 3. How do I improve for next year's budget advocacy season (months leading up to March 2022)?
- 4. What long term ideas do you have for advocacy/demonstrations?

Approved Motions from the Board Meeting

Bad

- 1. 7% increase to domestic undergraduate tuition.
- 4% increase to international undergraduate tuition prior to Fall 2020 (before cohort based funding model which dictates that students must given the same rate for their entire 4 year degree).
- 3. 5% increase to rates charged for UAlberta residences (final year of increase higher than CPI).
- A 3 year Capital Plan that will be submitted to provincial and federal governments in applications for funding the included projects. It did not include Maskwa House of Learning.





- 5. Motions approved in a subsequent Board Finance and Property Committee meeting:
 - a. 1.6% increase in mandatory non-instructional fees and the addition of a \$1.50 per Fall and Winter terms to pay for the Sexual Violence Prevention Coordinator.
 - b. 2% increase to all meal plan rates

Good (ish)

- 1. 15% of the 7% undergraduate domestic tuition will be used as needs-based financial aid.
- 2. 7.55% of all undergraduate international tuition (legacy and cohort models) will be used for approximately 30% needs based and 70% merit based financial aid for undergraduate international students. (This 30/70 split cannot be easily changed because the merit based aid is mostly committed to multiyear scholarships and incoming students.)
- 3. Motion approved in a subsequent Board Finance and Property Committee meeting: \$300 flex plans removed from Lister and Peter Lougheed Hall meal plans.

Student Advocacy Regarding the Budget

Leading Up to the Board Meeting

Students on the Board include the Graduate Students' Association President, the SU President and myself (referred to as the student caucus going forward).

- 1. SU put forward:
 - a. Social media marketing raising the issue of rate increases and inviting students to the Board meeting.
 - b. Perks surveys collecting student stories on how they'll be impacted by rate increases and how likely they are to stay at UAlberta. (Statistics cited and student stories were shared in a document with Board members before the vote.)
- 2. SU Councillors, Executives and I made snow penguins with signs at the Legislature building as a demonstration against budget cuts to UAlberta (forcing tuition up).
- 3. Student caucus met with Board members to hear their positions on tuition and potential solutions they have.
- 4. I sent a <u>Google Form</u> to consult SU Councillors and Executives, Faculty Association Presidents, Aboriginal Students' Council, and the International Students' Association's President to get detailed concerns and recommendations from student leaders.



In-Meeting Contributions

The student caucus voted against all increases and I voted against the Capital Plan because it did not include Maskwa House. Below are points we spoke to.

- 1. Rate increases impact student lives, especially in this pandemic year.
 - a. Campus Food Bank use is at a record high and graduate students disproportionately rely on it. In some cases this includes students' children.
 - b. The financial burden on students is already heavy and intersects with the mental health crisis.
 - c. Students are taking multiple jobs.
 - d. Students are transferring to cheaper institutions.
 - e. Current student aid allocation is not enough (see approved aid above).
 - f. International students have compounding struggles with the combination of poor exchange rates and a 4% increase.
- 2. Education quality
 - a. Being the second largest funder to the UAlberta budget, students should get high quality education.
 - b. With high rates, our university should rank better globally.
- 3. Students are not having a high quality experience in residences which is marketed to them and is the justification for high rates.
- 4. Maskwa House needs to be in the Capital Plan.
 - Answer: VP Facilities and Operations said he would look at putting it back on the Capital Plan.
- 5. Suggested solutions
 - a. 20% of excess tuition revenues be allocated to student financial aid.
 - Maskwa House: Board members with government relations need to make this
 project a priority with the government on the grounds of reconciliation with
 Indigenous students.
 - c. Market residences to people other than students to enable external revenue and reduce student burden.
 - i. Answer: already doing this; in summers (notwithstanding COVID) sports teams and other groups rent space. Admin has a revenue generation strategy. They see potential in their wraparound service.
 - d. More transparency around where our tuition goes.
 - e. Make sure Registrar's Office always aims for 0% unmet need for international students when financially planning.

Long Term Advocacy

1. Telling the student story in Board meetings and through protests to the government that we do not willingly take increases and that they impact our communities negatively.





Governor Konrad

- 2. Telling the Board and SU executives to advocate to GoA for stronger non-repayable student financial aid, to get closer to the Canadian average.
- Advocating to Board/GoA for budget deconsolidation from GoA financial books to allow UAlberta to debt finance their own initiatives and generate internal revenue to alleviate tuition pressure.
- 4. Continued research into peer institution funding models and how they offset tuition increases.
- 5. Advocate that UAlberta prioritize investing in students through work-integrated learning opportunities, who may attract scholarship/research donors through their achievements.

4 Transition

Tips for being the chair:

1. Review the CAC 2020/2021 Google Drive folder

Many resources you will need to see what CAC did last year are in this drive and will help you understand the work done. Check out the spreadsheet "CAC 2020/2021". It is where the expenditure during the year has been reported under the budget tracker. Also, the five permanent members were assigned specific committees to review their progress. You will have to encourage the permanent members to do this regularly as outlined in the CAC manual, and encourage other chairs, too, to provide information needed for the purpose of tracking progress on the sheet. You can create a similar sheet for the upcoming year. It can serve as a centralised space to record the committee's work.

2. Councillors' Jackets

Jackets are easy to do; you just need to stay on top of things. Start the process early in Summer. Ms. Elizabeth Johnson is the person I worked with this past year, in SUBmart. You just need to ask her what styles are available, get the style catalogue and agree on a style with CAC, and then send out a google form to all the council members plus the speaker to select their size and the name they want on the jacket. You can get an idea of how I did this in the 'Councillors' Jackets' subfolder in the 'CAC' folder. Then, you can send all that information to Elizabeth Johnson and the jackets will get made in time. I would suggest also accounting for councillors who may join later in the year during the by-election or even later; if possible, try and set aside funds for this purpose, and perhaps try and communicate with the company you order from that more jackets, albeit fewer will be needed in the future and if they could charge you the same when the time comes. You may discuss this with Ms. Elizabeth. Do this during the first order to set up the relationship for the future orders. This will save a lot of costs as ordering few jackets is costlier.

3. Oversight of DIE Board, Speaker, and Elections Office

As the chair of CAC, you oversee the above bodies/persons. In a normal year, that does not mean too much as all those folks are great at doing their work, but it does mean that if stuff does go wrong, you need to step in. Meet with both the CRO and the Chief Tribune of the DIE board regularly and invite them both to come to CAC regularly.

4. ARRC Recommendations

CAC worked extensively on ARRC (Aboriginal Relations and Reconciliation Committee) recommendations this past year. CAC focused on three ARRC recommendations as per this ARRC recommendations' tracker webpage and the ARRC Recommendations 2019 report, namely:

- 1. The <u>KAIROS</u> Blanket Exercise completed and approved second principles.
- 2. Bylaw 100 translation to Cree ongoing.
- 3. Land Acknowledgement Guide continued work, which began in 2019/2020.

Permanent members of CAC reached out to various stakeholders in our process of meeting these recommendations. However, towards the ending of the year, after a whole year of working on the recommendations, ARRC wanted to do some more consultation and said that the ARRC Recommendations 2019 report was out-of-date. Hence, we put our ongoing work on hold, and as the next chair of CAC, please reach out to ARRC and get this work completed. You may also find it valuable to reach out to ASC (Aboriginal Students' Council). Valuable resources will be past CAC members, too. You can reach them by email and request them to help you with information of the specific work they did.

5. Standing Order Changes

Most of the work at CAC will involve reviewing the standing orders of council. Ensure that changes made are reflected in official documents being used by the Students' Union. Also, ensure that changes made are implemented. I suggest indicating when changes will come into effect after they have been approved. Otherwise, approved changes will just remain on paper and in meeting minutes. They will never make their way to being put into practice. A key relationship here will be to follow up with administrative staff. Kristen Stoik, the Administrative Services Manager of SU would be a valuable resource in such cases.

Advice for Next Year

Top 3 pieces of general advice

- 1. Get everything done over the summer whenever possible.
- Consult stakeholders and continue working in tandem with them. Ask every single
 question you can to anyone you can. Thomas Banks, Kristen Stoik, Navneet Chand, and
 experienced councillors can be great resources.
- 3. Read everything above and read the trimesterly reports that I have submitted to council. You will also find them in the CAC folder. They will be very helpful in understanding what has been done. Also, read the CAC Manual all your duties have been outlined there.

Activities of that committee during the trimester

- This trimester Nominating Committee appointed 2 members to vacancies on the Sustainability Committee.
- Alongside committee appointments, this trimester nominating committee aided in the setting of a record at the University of Alberta for the most number of students involved in GFC in university history. For the first time ever all undergraduate seats on GFC have been filled.

- The committee elected to run an application process for the two vacant positions for the Faculty of ALES, we then conducted interviews with the candidates and provided recommendations for ratification at Students' Council
- The committee ran an application process for the vacant positions on Sustainability Committee and selected applicants for ratification at Students' Council

Transition materials

- Much of Nom Com's work is front loaded to the start of the semester. It's important to meet early and get started quickly to ensure the smooth operation of many of the committees on council.
- This year we started off our committee with a professional development session around Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion. This was quite helpful for the committee and allowed us to have a better understanding of how to operationalize the principles of EDI in our work. I would strongly recommend the committee takes similar action in the next year
- One of the difficult parts of Nominating Committee is getting individuals to apply to positions. Whenever possible it's suggested that the nominating committee works to disseminate the positions to the best of their ability to as many constituents as possible. Working with student groups, student representative associations, and other student representatives is highly encouraged to build a strong applicant pool.
- One step I took as chair this year was to abstain from voting within meetings except in the event of a tie. A tie did not happen, however by abstaining and instead focusing on procedure and governance I feel as though the committee was more able to complete its work
- NomCom is a fantastic committee if you're hoping to be engaged. If you have any questions about it, don't hesitate to reach out!

Structure and Function

Policy Committee is composed of nine (9) members:

- UASU Vice President Academic, ex-officio
- UASU Vice President Student Life, ex-officio
- UASU Vice President External, ex-officio
- Six (6) UASU Councillors elected by Students' Council

Quorum of the Policy Committee is five (5) voting members. Quorum means the number of members required present to pass any motion in the Policy Committee.

Typically a member of the UASU Administrative team will be present to take meeting minutes (a record of everything said at the meeting), however this may not happen for the first few meetings. For that time being, either you or another committee member should take meeting minutes so that Students' Council can be informed of the committee's work.

Need to Know:

Understand the difference between Political Policy and Operational Policy. The Policy Committee <u>IS</u> responsible for political policy, but it <u>IS NOT</u> responsible for Operational Policy. This is important to understand in the event that a member of the committee has an idea for a new policy. You can then effectively determine if the policy is something the committee should pursue and you are able to ask the right questions before the member starts drafting any policy.

- **Political Policy:** statements of principle set out by the Students' Council that direct the Executive Committee in their advocacy efforts. They set out the formal position of the Students' Union on the political issues of the day. It then becomes the job of the Executive Committee to implement the political policies as they best see fit. These policies are more broad and are meant to give a general direction for advocacy. Any SRAs with UASU delegated authority are also bound to Political Policy in their advocacy efforts as a general principle.
- **Operational Policy:** provides a framework regarding UASU service delivery and service arrangements. It should outline the context of the service, explain the service philosophy of care and give clear referral and assessment procedures.

General Responsibilities as Chair

- Facilitate committee discussion and act in a non-biased manner.

Scheduling Meetings

- **Establish a meeting schedule and meeting room** (if applicable) for each trimester. There are three (3) trimesters and they go as follows:
 - Summer Trimester, May August
 - Fall Trimester, September December
 - Winter Trimester, January April
- **Policy meetings will occur bi-weekly**. At the end of each trimester, you will send out a new poll to determine a new meeting time that can accommodate everyone's academic and work schedule. For example. You would send out a poll for the fall semester at the end of the summer semester to ensure there is not confusion for the committee. I recommend using Doodle Poll!

Committee Preparation

- Develop a strategic goals document with the committee. This should include individual and
 collective goals for the committee. I recommend doing this at the beginning of each trimester
 because priorities change over the course of the year and plans can be disrupted. This is
 important so that as chair you understand what each member hopes to get out of their
 experience and you can find ways to help them reach those goals.
- **Draft an agenda for each meeting**. This outlines everything the committee will be discussing prior to the meeting taking place, and members should be given the agenda as early as possible.

Submitting Motions to Council

- When the Policy committee submits a motion to approve policy at Students' Council, someone will have to submit them to the council Order Papers (essentially Council's agenda) before 8AM on the Friday before a Students' Council meeting. I recommend that you plan to submit them sooner rather than later and set a reminder to do the submissions on the Thursday before the deadline.
- If you miss the order paper deadline, you can also submit the motion to the Late Additions, but Late additions should only be used for urgent matters that need to be addressed by council generally.

Reporting

- At each Students' Council meeting, you will be responsible for giving an oral report of what the committee has been up to since the last Council Meeting.
- **Draft a report at the end of each trimester** containing what the committee has accomplished thus far and submit it to council. You will do three (3) of these reports in total.
- When a policy has first and second principles, make sure you send it to the administrative staff so that they can update the policy to the website.

Future Tasks for Consideration

- Regular monitoring of the resources within Political Policy located in the Students' Union website to ensure that students can access the information if they so choose.
- Solidify a citation format for the resources section of policy.
- Development of consultation pathways to review policy from a more representative student lens.

- Completion of a Climate Action Policy (initial draft can be found in the Google Drive)
- Completion of an Online Proctoring Policy (resources can be found in the Google Drive)
- Completion of a Campus Policing Policy.

My Advice

- Once a motion is passed at the Policy Committee, someone needs to submit the motions to the Students' Council Order Papers. I advise that you submit them so that one person is responsible for getting them in on time and ensuring they are property formatted. The template for how policy must be submitted can be found in the <u>Policy Committee Standing Orders Appendix 2</u>.
- Set a precedent of ALWAYS having a meeting bi-weekly and never cancelling. This is important because it creates consistency and keeps the committee on top of their work and meeting any deadlines.
- Ensure that any policy drafting is done OUTSIDE of Policy Committee and Committee time is for discussion, minor changes and amendments, and approvals. Meetings are typically an hour in length, so you don't want to spend all of that time writing policy.
- Renew Policies which are set to expire by the end of your term BEFORE renewing any other policies or drafting new policy. If a policy does not get renewed before the expiry date, it will cease to exist until renewed again.
- Set clear deadlines for when you expect to have committee members submit policy drafts to you for the meeting agenda.

SINGH (Guest): Inquired as to whether Bylaw Committee 'consult with and solicit feedback from relevant or affected parties' pursuant to Bylaw Standing Orders 15.3(a) before approving Bill 10 for First Principles.

FOTANG: Deferred the question to Agarwal.

AGARWAL: Respond that the rationale for Bill 10 is to close gaps in SU bylaws. Clarified that First Principles are guiding principles only and that the Council of Faculty Associations (COFA), Council of Residence Associations (CORA), and student representative associations (SRA) will be consulted on the details of Bill 10 in Second Principles.

HERKENDAAL (Guest): Opposed Bill 10 First Principles on the basis that they are being proposed without sufficient consultation and that the additional oversight mechanisms they seek to implement are unnecessary and unduly burdensome for volunteers.

AGARWAL: Noted that a central purpose of Bill 10 is to ensure transparency in SRA election reporting.

KIDD: Clarified the extent of the Bill 10 meeting reporting requirements is that SRA will submit an excel sheet once per trimester outlining who they met when and what they generally discussed.

SINHA (Guest): Inquired as to why Bill 10 is being rushed without sufficient consultation.

AGARWAL: Responded that Council is seeking to approve Bill 10 before the end of the session because its aims are important and there is no guarantee it will be implemented if Council defers the Bill.

SUN (Guest): Inquired as to why Bill 10 is necessary to approve in the current session.

AGARWAL: Responded that the SU is concerned about SRA activities given an incident involving an SRA that jeopardised the SU's relationship with its healthcare broker Studentcare by surreptitiously reaching out to a competitor company.

KRAHN/SARETZKY MOVED that Students' Council approve the financing strategy for the Horowitz Renovation and Expansion project and to authorize the Executive Committee to enter into such agreements as are required to execute such financing, subject to the following terms: (1) Primary financing from the University of \$15.165M over a term of 25 years at a rate not to exceed 4%; (2) Use of SCF retained reserves in an amount of \$1.2M; (3) Fundraising and grants will be pursued, with a goal amount of \$1.5M or such amount as is required to complete the project; (4) Where fundraising and grants amount to less than \$1.5M or are insufficient to complete the project, borrowing the remaining funds from the Student Involvement and Endowment Fund in an amount not to exceed \$1.5M and at a term not to exceed 25 years and an interest rate not to exceed 4%; (5) All financing obligations to be funded from revenues from the Sustainability and Capital Fund levy; and, (6) Any deviations from these terms must be approved by Students' Council by no less than a 75% majority vote.

DUMOUCHEL: Clarified that the SU is not seeking a grant but a loan that is financed from Alberta Government treasury bonds and secured via the University. Noted that the approval of the loan is not guaranteed but is expected.

EINARSON: Recognised that many concerns about the Bill relate to reporting meetings. Invited individuals interested in the Bill's amendments to contact them.

OLIVERA: Invited individuals interested in the Bill's amendments to contact them.

LEY: Clarified that the Bill does not seek to prevent individuals from meeting with the Alberta Government to discuss issues affecting the student constituency they represent. Noted that the SU is willing to follow the exact same meeting reporting requirements it introduces for SRA in addition to the current reporting it must do for the Alberta Lobbyist Registry. Noted that the purpose of the Bill is to prevent SRA from violating SU political policy or undermining its advocacy.

BLANCHETTE (Guest): Expressed concern that there has been insufficient consultation on the proposed First Principles.

KIDD: Suggested that the Bill benefits SRA in that it enhances the level of support the SU can offer to struggling SRA (lessening the risk of derecognition occuring) and enhances the legitimacy of SRA election results by ensuring their election data is verified.

SINGH (Guest): Expressed concern that the Bill has the potential to elevate faculty associations above SRA such that SRA lose members where there are overlapping constituencies. Expressed concern that the reporting requirements the Bill seeks to introduce would be problematic as the UAISA has meetings the content of which is confidential and bound by non-disclosure agreements. Agreed that it would be beneficial for the SU to verify SRA election data but rejected that the SU should manage SRA elections. Expressed concern that the approval of the Bill is being rushed. Proposed that Council defer controversial aspects of the Bill to the next session where more consultation can be completed.

LEY: Responded that legal issues about meeting reporting will be considered in Second Principles.

DUMOUCHEL: Suggested that it makes no sense for an SRA acting with SU delegated authority to have meetings that are secret from the SU.

BEASLEY (Guest): Suggested that the Bill needs more consultation in order to respect affected parties and to take their views into account to improve the Bill.

FOTANG: Noted that Bylaw Committee is seeking feedback and consultation from Council.

SINGH: Suggested that the proposed meeting reporting requirements would not apply in cases where the ISA student group is meeting with the Alberta Government, even when the meeting is relevant to the UAISA and the SU's interests.
