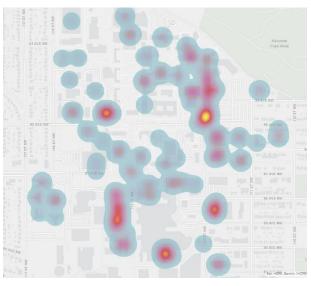
## Campuses & Facilities Safety & Security System Framework

**Problem Statement:** The CFSS WG is to undertake a comprehensive review of safety & security across university campuses (North, South, CSJ, Augustana, Enterprise Square) to develop a report with short & long term strategies to address the issues & concerns of thefts, break-ins, assaults, or drug / alcohol related incidents & trespassers / suspicious persons on University property.

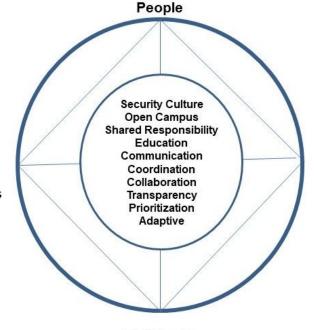

- 3. Implementation of action plan.

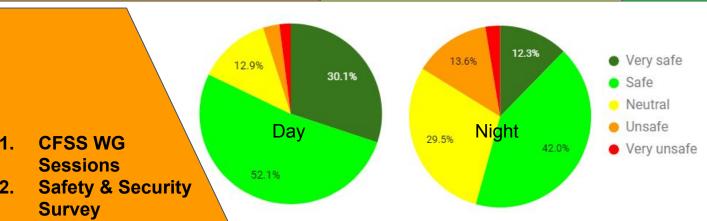

Security Staffing Plan



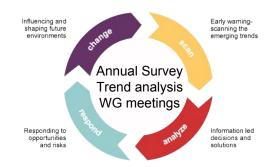
Infrastructure Plan



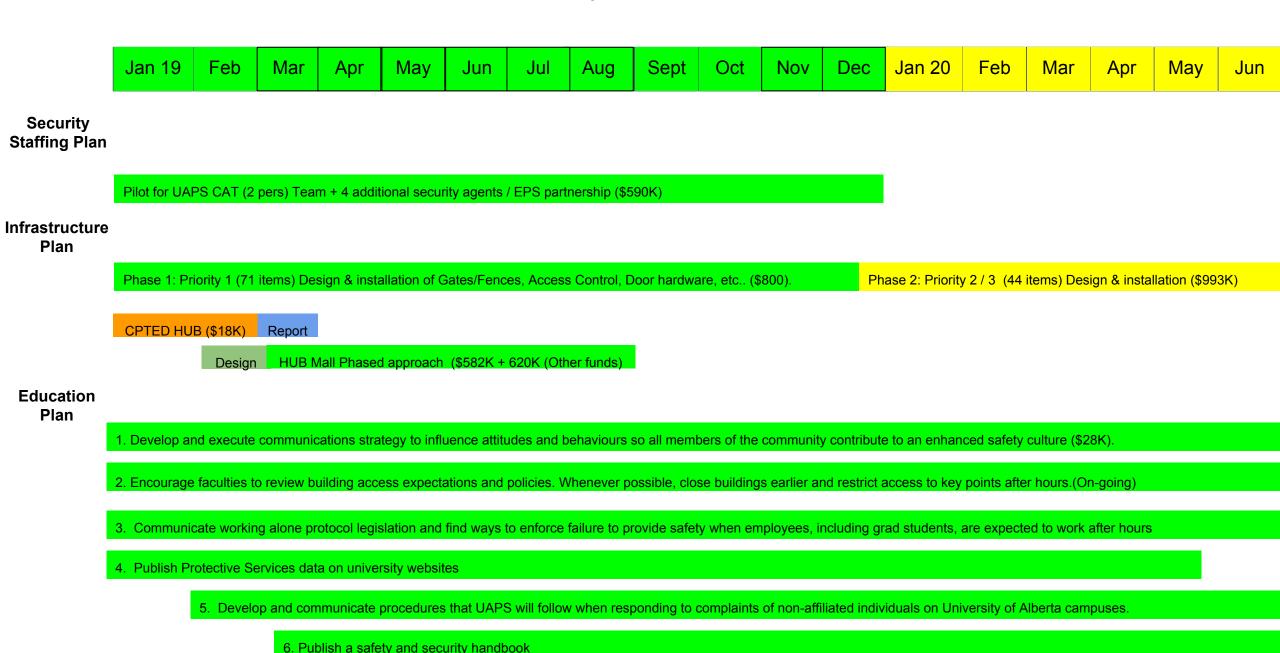
